HOUSE BILL NO. 1096

## AN ACT

To enact R.S. 17:416(G), relative to pupil discipline; to prohibit the taking of any disciplinary action against a pupil by the governing authority of a public elementary or secondary school or by any public elementary or secondary school administrator, teacher, or other school employee for the use of force upon another person under specified circumstances involving self-defense of the pupil or the pupil's property; to provide for application; to provide for effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 17:416(G) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§416. Discipline of pupils; suspension; expulsion

\* \* \*

G.(1) Effective for the 1997-1998 school year and thereafter, no pupil shall be disciplined in any manner by the governing authority of a public elementary or secondary school or by any public elementary or secondary school administrator, teacher, or other school employee for the use of force upon another person when it can be reasonably concluded that the use of such force more probably than not was committed solely for the purpose of preventing a forcible offense

against the pupil or a forcible offense provided that the force used must be reasonable and apparently necessary to prevent such offense.

(2) A pupil who is the aggressor or who brings on a difficulty cannot claim the right provided by this Subsection to defend himself.

Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 1997; if vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1, 1997, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.
